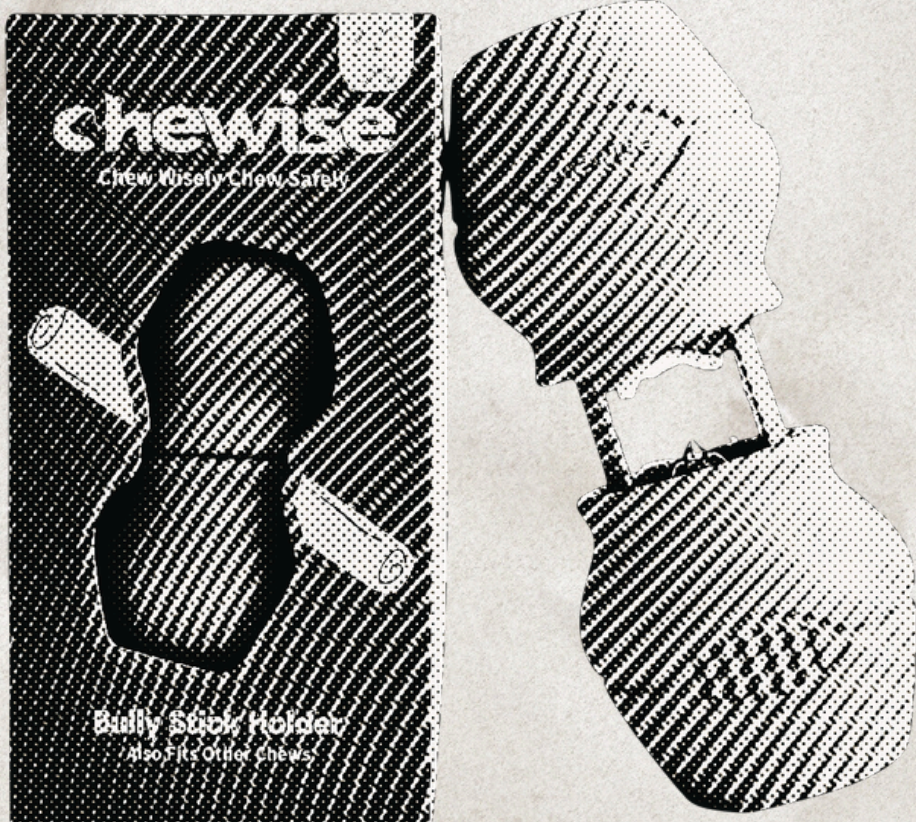

HEATWAVE WARNING ISSUED FOR DOGS

A FEW SIMPLE WAYS TO HELP KEEP YOUR DOG COOL

As temperatures rise, a few simple changes can make a big difference in keeping your dog cool and happy.



THE PAVEMENT TEST

If you cannot hold your hand on the pavement for 5 seconds, your dog should not be walking on it.

No exceptions. Not even a quick walk.

HYDRATION IS CRITICAL

Fresh water should always be available.

Ice cubes and frozen treats can help keep dogs cool, and refilling the bowl before they stare at you like you've failed them is strongly recommended.

WALKS: RECONSIDER EVERYTHING

Walk early. Walk late. Avoid the hottest part of the day.

If your dog refuses to walk, they are not being difficult. They are correct.

SIGNS OF HEATSTROKE

Do not ignore the following:

- Heavy panting
- Excessive drooling
- Lethargy
- Vomiting
- Wobbling

If symptoms appear, cool them down immediately and contact a vet.

FINAL NOTE

If your dog has chosen not to move today...Respect that.
